Reading Features

Engage in story times.

Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them.

Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences.

Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.

Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.

Purpose: To be a confident reader.

Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programme.

Retell the story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text, some as exact repetition and some in their own words.

Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter-sound correspondences and, where necessary, a few exception words.

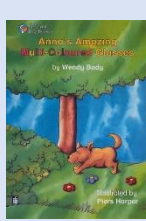
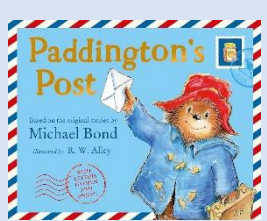

5. To write a sentence about what I can see when I wear the special glasses using the connective 'and'.

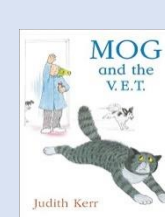
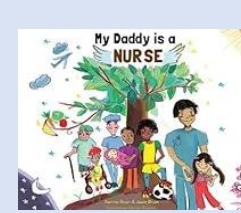
6. Write a sentence about a vet and how they help animals. Try to use a connective 'and'.

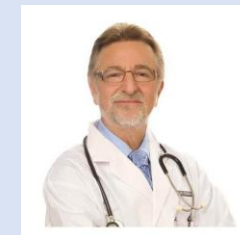
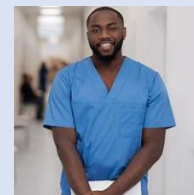
Emergency Vehicles
